

Type the Title in Times New Roman 18 pt in no more than two lines, single line spacing (apply spacing 0 pt before and 18 pt after)

Keywords: piezometers, landslides (12 pt, left justify; 13 pt exact spacing; 0 pt before and 15 pt after)

ABSTRACT: Instruction for the preparation of the papers for the DMT'15 Conference is presented in this template. All papers have to be prepared strictly according to the instructions set below. The publisher will reduce the camera-ready copy to 75% and print it in black and white only (the electronic version can include colours). Please, contain the abstract (Times New Roman 12 pt, 13 pt exact line spacing, apply 0 pt before and 30 pt after) within 5 to 8 lines. Authors have to type their paper in a form suitable for direct photographic reproduction by the publisher. Once your paper is formatted, please send both the PDF and the MS Word (DOC or DOCX) versions of your paper to: papers@dmt15.com (try to keep the electronic version of the paper within 2 or 3 MB). Papers should not exceed 8 pages.

1 INTRODUCTION

These are instructions for the preparation of full papers to be published in the Proceedings of the DMT'15 Conference.

Please follow the instructions carefully. Send your full paper by e-mail to papers@dmt15.com no later than 15 January 2015.

Name your file as follows: family name (one author); family names of authors separated by "&" (two authors); family name of first Author followed by "et al." (more than two authors). The affiliation and the e-mail address of each author have to be kept within one line only.

2 GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 *Type area*

The paper should be prepared according to the instructions provided in this section. Use the formatting of this template and do not change it. The text should fit exactly into the type area of 187 × 257 mm. Check the margin setting and column setting (see Table 1 for correct settings).

2.2 *Typefont, typesize and spacing*

Type all the text of the paper in Times New Roman, never use bold style, never underline anywhere in

the paper. Never use letterspacing and never use more than one space between two words.

Type the title of the paper at the top of the first page in Times New Roman 18 pt in no more than two lines, single line spacing (no indentation); apply spacing 0 pt before and 18 pt after. Justify the title.

Type the name(s) of the author(s) in Times New Roman 14 pt font size singly spaced underneath the paper title; apply spacing 0 pt before and after.

The author's designation, institution name in short, and e-mail should follow in the next line. Keep the details of each author brief enough to be accommodated in one line. Type the author's affiliation in Times New Roman 12 pt font size and 13 pt exact line spacing. Apply 5 pt after each author's affiliation line. Apply to the last author's affiliation line 48 pt after.

Type the keywords' line in Times New Roman 12 pt font size in no more than one single spacing line (left justify) applying spacing 0 pt before and 15 pt after.

Type **ABSTRACT:** followed directly by the abstract itself, which should run across both the columns. Type the abstract in Times New Roman 12 pt font size and 13 pt exact line spacing; apply spacing 0 pt before and 30 pt after.

The primary section headings are in capital letters, the subsections headings in Italic style. Section and subsection headings should be left-aligned.

Type the primary headings in Times New Roman 12 pt font size and 13 pt exact lines spacing. Apply spacing 26 pt before and 12 pt after. Leave no spacing before the first primary heading of the paper “1 INTRODUCTION”. If the primary heading is immediately followed by a secondary heading apply to the primary heading 0 pt after.

For the secondary headings use Times New Roman 12 pt font size and 13 pt exact line spacing. Apply spacing 26 pt before and 6 pt after. If the secondary heading immediately follows the primary heading apply spacing 7 pt before (see as example, above “2.1 *Type area*”).

Use 0.76 cm indentation for primary and secondary headings.

The third level heading will be in 12 pt Times New Roman and 13 pt exact line spacing. Apply spacing 13 pt before and 3 pt after. Use 1 cm indentation for the third level of heading.

Use Times New Roman 12 pt font size for the rest of the text and 13 pt exact line spacing. Do not indent the first line of text following the heading.

2.2.1 Paragraphs

Paper text must be justified. The first paragraph of each section needs no indentation. Paragraphs after the first paragraph of each section need an indentation at the first line 0.5 pt, as shown in this template. Leave no line space between the paragraphs of each section.

2.2.2 Tables

Type the text in the tables in Times New Roman 10 pt font size and 11 pt exact line spacing. Table title should be 11 pt Times New Roman and 10 pt exact line spacing. The title is centered above the table. Table title should be 12 pt before and 6 pt after.

Tables and Figures, centered, should preferably be placed at the top or bottom of the page.

Table 1. Editorial Instructions.

| Item | Explanation |
|------------|--|
| Paper size | Use A4 format (210 × 297 mm) |
| Length | Full papers should not exceed 8 pages |
| Margins | Leave 2 cm as margin on top, 2 cm as margin on bottom, 1.15 cm as margins on left and right side; consider 9 cm as column width and 0.7 cm as column spacing |
| Fonts | Use 18 point Times New Roman font for Title; use 14 point Times New Roman font for Authors; use 12 point Times New Roman font and 13 point exact line spacing for text; use 11 point Times New Roman font for text in tables and 11 point Times New Roman font for figure captions |

2.2.3 Figures




Fig. 1. Insert figure caption here.

Figures and photographs must carry numbers in the text, e.g. Fig. 1. Apply spacing 12 pt before figures. Figure captions are centered below the figure, in 11 pt Times New Roman and 10 pt exact line spacing. Apply spacing 12 pt before and after figure caption.

Captions should be complete enough to allow appreciation of the illustration without referring to the text. Figures should fit within the column width of 90 mm or within type area of 187 mm.

Figures and photos are encouraged to be prepared with high resolution. Notes should be avoided. Insert the information in the text. Consider that the publisher will reduce the camera-ready copy to 75% and print it in black and white only. Letters in the figures should not be less than 2 mm (1.5 mm after reduction).

2.2.4 Equations

Equations must be prepared using equation editors of the selected word processing programme. Equations are not indented. Apply 4 pt before and 4 pt after the equations.

The equation numbers are placed at the end of the line, between parentheses. Refer to equations by these numbers. See for example, Eq. (1) below:

$$K_t = \left(1 - \frac{R^2 \tau}{c_a + v \tan \delta} \right)^4 k_1 \quad (1)$$

where, c_a = interface adhesion; δ = friction angle at interface; and k_1 = shear stiffness number. Possibly transform equations into images.

For simple equations in the text always use super- and subscript. Do not use the equation editor in a line of text.

2.2.5 References and Units

In the text, place the authors' last names (without initials) and the date of publication in parentheses e.g. Brinkgreve (2000).

Use the following style for references between parentheses: (Brinkgreve 2000). If there are two authors, use "&" between the two authors' last name; if there are more than two authors use the tag "et. al."

For figure and table references in the text and between parentheses, use: Fig. 1 and Table 1, Figs 2-4, 6, 8a, b. Always use the official SI notations.

3 CONCLUSIONS

Conclusions should state concisely the most important finding of the paper.

4 REFERENCES

At the end of the paper list all references in alphabetical order as in the example below.

The first line of each reference has no indentation while the remaining lines have the same indentation 0.5 cm, as shown below. For references text use 11 pt Times New Roman font size and 11 pt exact spacing lines.
